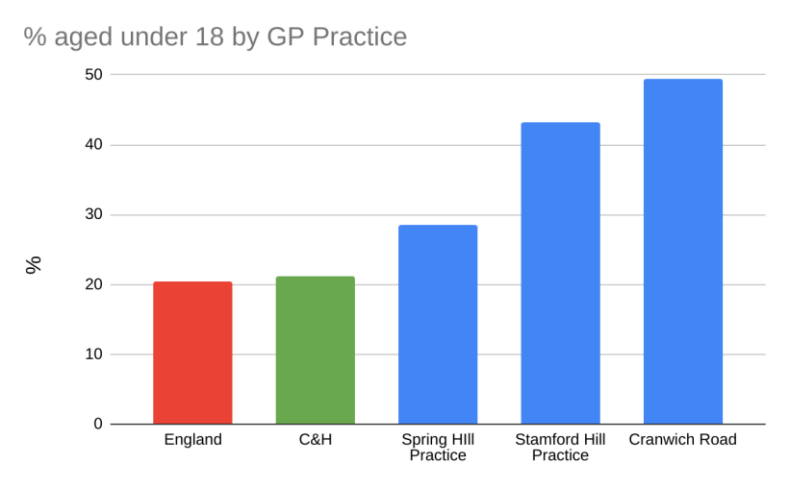
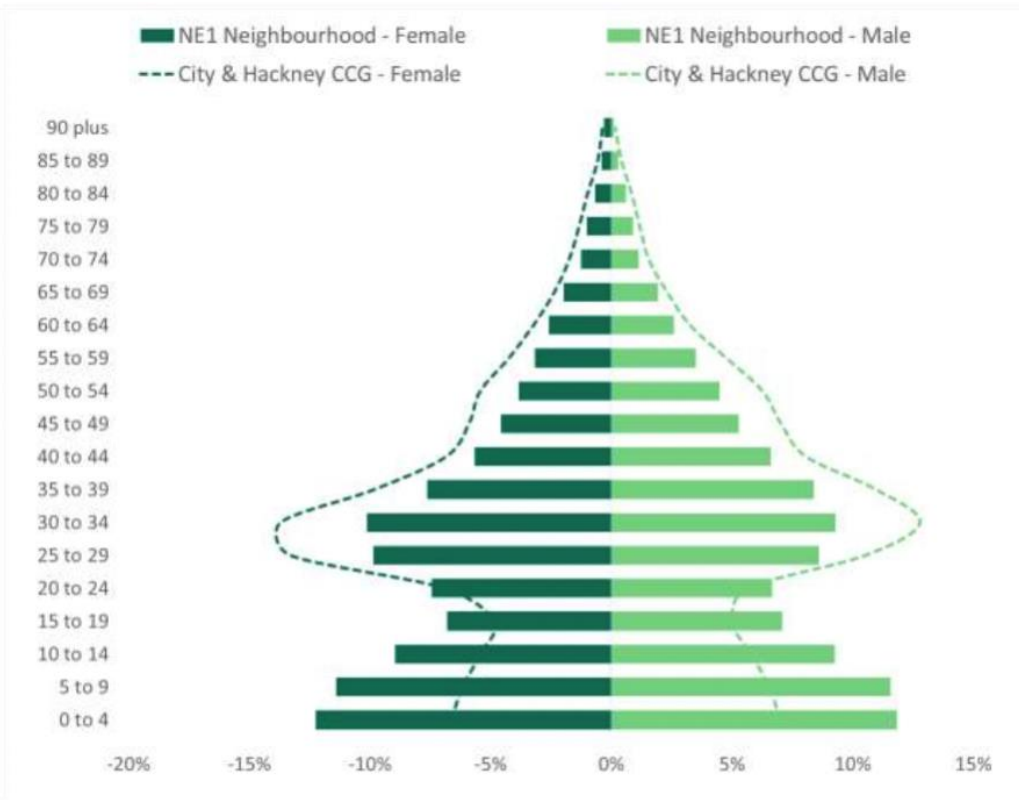
Future

- Young population
- Pregnant women > 10%
- High deprivation
- Three GP surgeries
- Three pharmacies

Primary care networks – key to the future

- Primary care networks are small enough to give a sense of **local ownership**, but big enough to have **impact** across a 30-50K population.
- They will comprise groupings of clinicians and wider staff **sharing a vision** for how to improve the care of their population and will serve as **service delivery units** and a **unifying platform** across the country.

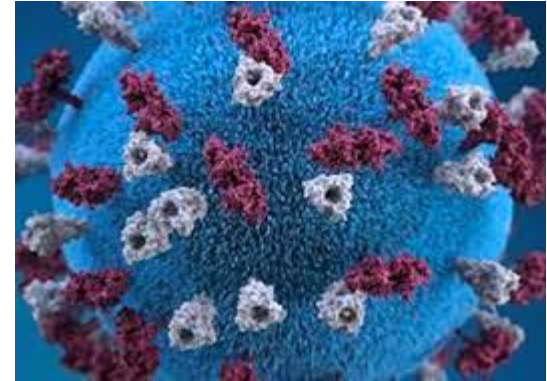

Confidence

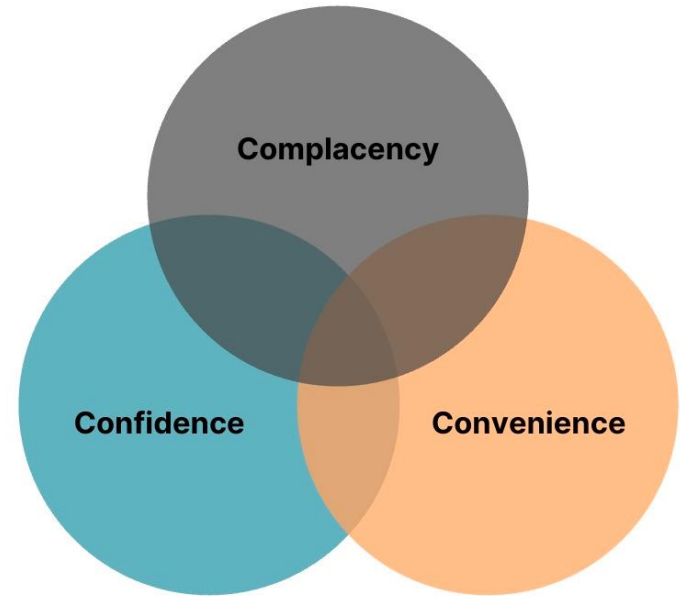
- Language barriers
- Female health, fertility, pregnancy
- Long term health and side effects
- Concerns about vaccine efficacy

Convenience

- Not registered with a GP but happy to take vaccine when directed to a walk-in
- Not willing to travel to vaccine centre, lack of transport

Complacency

- Too many other competing priorities

Co-production with communities

Working in partnership with community organisations as an effective way to engage in a meaningful way and to improve awareness around health and wellbeing issues and services



Co-designed communications

Ensure the communication channels used are appropriate for the community and respond to key community health concerns.



Co-produced resources

Ensure support is culturally sensitive and matches needs of the community.



Focus on targeted populations

Build in a greater focus on supporting the health needs of specific populations to ensure support is relevant.



Focus on broad range of health topics

There is a need to continue to focus on wider health needs beyond COVID-19 vaccination in future events; community feedback and data highlights potential for further focus on dental health and oral hygiene and child immunisations, among others.



Promotion of local health services

Continue to ensure the community are aware of available local services, and ensure these are accessible.
